### 9. **Report of the Executive Director:**

#### A. Monthly Management Report

Mr. Longo reported that:

<u>Academy Lofts</u>: The Grand Opening on April 17<sup>th</sup> was very successful We are now working toward a final closing

<u>South End Phase III:</u> Construction is complete, except for a few punch list items which primarily involve things that could not be done until the spring weather arrived. We finished with a \$275,000 budget surplus (in spite of unexpected expenses associated with soil removal) and we have brought in additional funds from NYSERDA (\$140,000) & FHLB (\$350,000). We are hopeful that this will result in full payment of AHA's Development Fee without deferral.

<u>Ida Yarbrough Redevelopment Phase I:</u> HCR did not approve our application for funding with 9% Low Income Housing Tax Credits. We were disappointed because we feel we had a very strong application on the merits and we are actively pursuing possible alternatives such as 4% Tax Credits with assistance from other sources and we may move forward with another application to HCR.

<u>Capital South Campus Center:</u> We have had discussions with HCR that suggest if we can get assurance from Schenectady County Community College that they will run culinary programs at CSCC our application for approximately \$750,000 CIF money to complete the kitchen may be successful. We will be meeting with CSCC in an effort to firm up their commitment.

<u>Summer youth program</u>: Chiquita D'Arbeau has a full program worked out for the kids that will begin July 8<sup>th</sup> and run for 4 weeks. The effort is to assure the kids will have a positive & productive experience.

#### **B.** Monthly Financial Report (Deputy Director)

Mr. Ragsdale provided graphic reports of the financial status of the Federal & Component Unit Programs. The Federal Program is currently running at a deficit because of subsidy cuts, but we had planned for that; we expect the subsidy to increase next quarter; and we expect to have funds available from the component units and development fees that will be sufficient to bring the federal program into balance.
