

- Are you under the age of 24?
- Do you or your family live in public housing?
- Would you be living in public housing if it wasn't for your juvenile or criminal record, or "rap sheet"?
- Is your "rap sheet" getting in the way of housing, employment, or other opportunities?

If you are ages 18-24 and have a juvenile or criminal record, and you or your family live in public housing, or if you have been denied public access housing based on your record, the Juvenile Reentry Assistance Program, or **JRAP**, can help.

We are a program that offers "clean up your rap sheet" services. We can help obtain a copy of your rap sheet and review it with you to see if there are any errors. We will work with you on making sure these errors are fixed. We can also assist you with advice on how to handle prospective employers and what your rights are as a job applicant, as well as assist you with accessing education.

JRAP is funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Department of Justice (DOJ) Second Chance Act funds.
