Steven Longo 30 Years Of Service The coronavirus pandemic has shown us how important it is to have accurate contact information on file all for all of our residents. To help us become as efficient as possible, please remember to provide current contact information including e-mail, and alternative or emergency contacts when returning your reexamination packet.



Albany Housing Authority needs the help of all its residents to keep our drains running properly. Liquefied fat, oil, or grease (FOG) that is poured down the kitchen sink can cause serious impact. FOG can cling to the insides of pipes and the sewer system. Over time, it can build up and eventually block pipes completely. If wastewater can not move freely through the pipes and out into the sewer system, it can back up into your or your neighbors home and cause unsanitary conditions and damages that can be expensive to repair.

The Albany Housing Authority spends thousands of dollars to clear drains. This is money that would otherwise be used for programs and improvements in and around the properties

Flushable Wipes

Can increase the risk of clogged sewer lines and require pumping of septic tanks more often.
