Resident Councils empower you to represent your neighbors, address community needs, and strengthen relationships with Albany Housing Authority (AHA) management.

What Does a Resident Council Do?

- -Advocate for resident concerns and priorities.
 - -Plan community programs and initiatives.
- -Collaborate with management to improve housing and services.
 - -Follow HUD Guidelines to remain in good standing.

Steps to Get Started

- -Vote to establish a Resident Council with your neighbors.
- -Define membership eligibility, meeting frequency, and decision-making processes.
 - -Create bylaws that outline the council's purpose, structure, and operations.
 - -Conduct elections that are fair, transparent, and follow HUD regulations.
 - -Develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with AHA.

-Be Heard: Make sure your voice matters.

-Build Community: Work with neighbors to create a better place to live.

-Create Change: Partner with AHA to improve your neighborhood.
